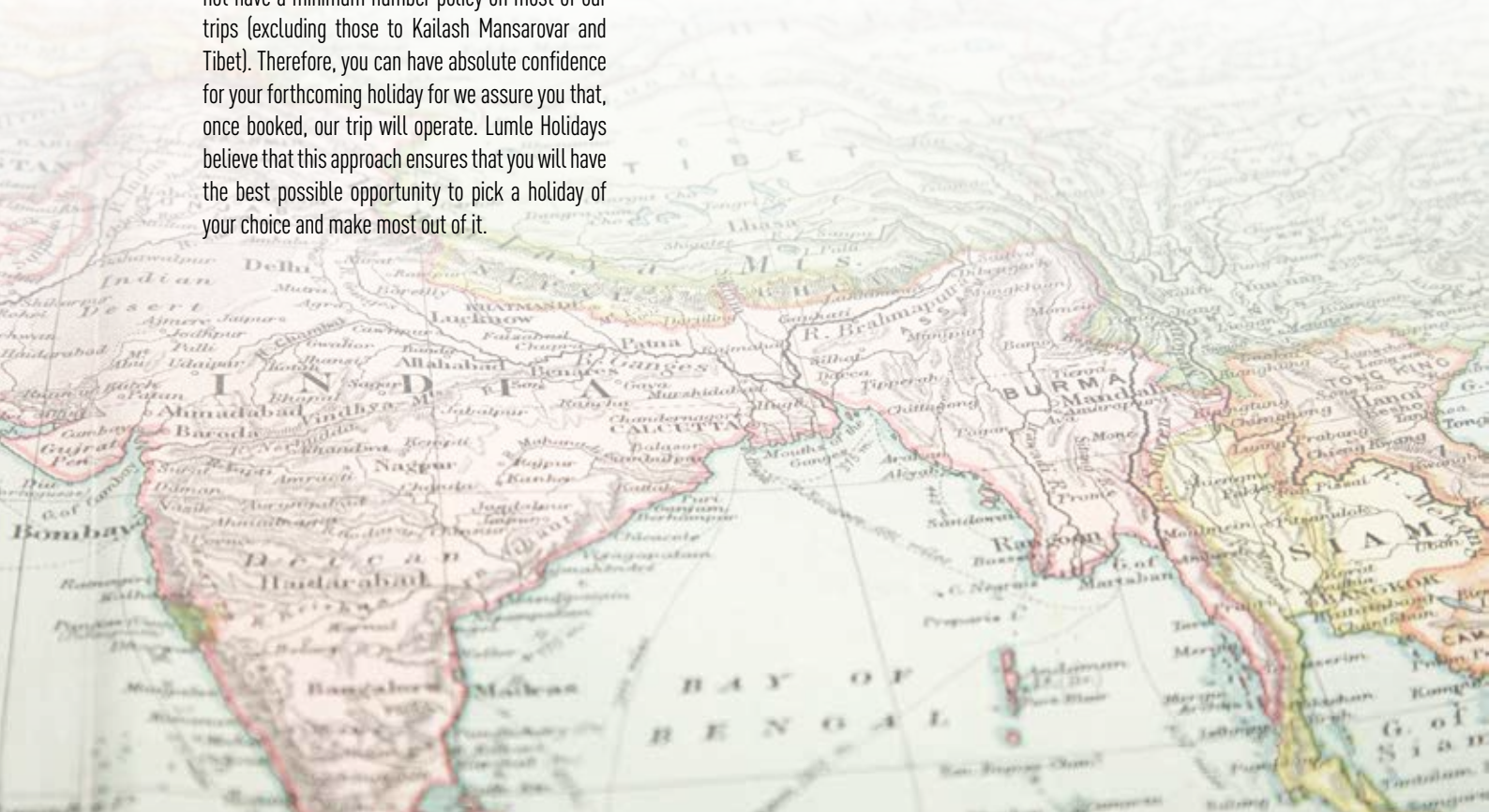

Jaipur

Jodhpur

Stands on a range of sandstone hills surrounded by a strong wall. Dominating the city is a massive fortress. Sightseeing of Jodhpur includes visits to the Fort, Palaces, and Armoury and Jaswant Thada.

Mandawa

The medieval fort of Mandawa gradually rises on the horizon like a mirage. A breath-taking view of the town can be seen from the terrace of Castle Mandawa.

Jaisalmer

Jaisalmer is a city of sheer magic and brilliance of the desert. The places of interest include Jaisalmer Fort, Patwon Ki Haveli each famous for its intricately latticed and conspicuous facades.

Chittaurgarh

The Chittor Fort reposes on a rocky hill which rises steeply from the town. Behind every stone is some tale of Heroism and Romance. Bundi – It has most picturesque location isolated and independent that it appears like a miniature. It presents one of the finest examples of Rajput Architecture..

Mount Abu

It is famous for the celebrated Dilwara temples sacred to the Jains. Containing some of the finest sculptures and carvings in India.

Bikaner

Stands on the northern tip of the desert triangle. Junagadh Fort, is the main attraction of Bikaner. It houses a museum of valuable miniature paintings and other rare items that are several centuries old.

Bandhavgarh

Bandhavgarh National Park lies in the Vindhyan range of Madhya Pradesh and was once the royal hunting ground for the rulers of the by gone era of Rewa. Bandhavgarh National Park is an exquisite amalgamation of its wildlife beauty and historic monument Bandhavgarh Fort. The park is largely covered with Sal forest that forms the perfect abode to the diverse variety of wildlife including a large number of tigers.

Udaipur

Stands in a valley, amidst green hills on the banks of the lake Pichola. Along the shores of the lake is the palace of the Maharana. The places of interest are City Palace, Sahelion Ki Bari, Ekilingji and Nagda Temples, Jagdish Temple, boat ride on lake Pichola and Gulab Niwas Garden.

Pushkar

It is a town of religious activity. During a full moon, thousands of pilgrims come to bath in the holy waters of Pushkar Lake. Colourful bazaars are set up; camels are paraded and also bought and sold.

Ranthambore

Ranthambore National Park is another famous national park in India. Situated in Rajasthan, it too houses the Bengal Tiger. In the park, you can see the tigers relaxing, at the hunt or just having some fun. A visit to the Ranthambore National Park will make you fall in love with these majestic animals.


Corbett

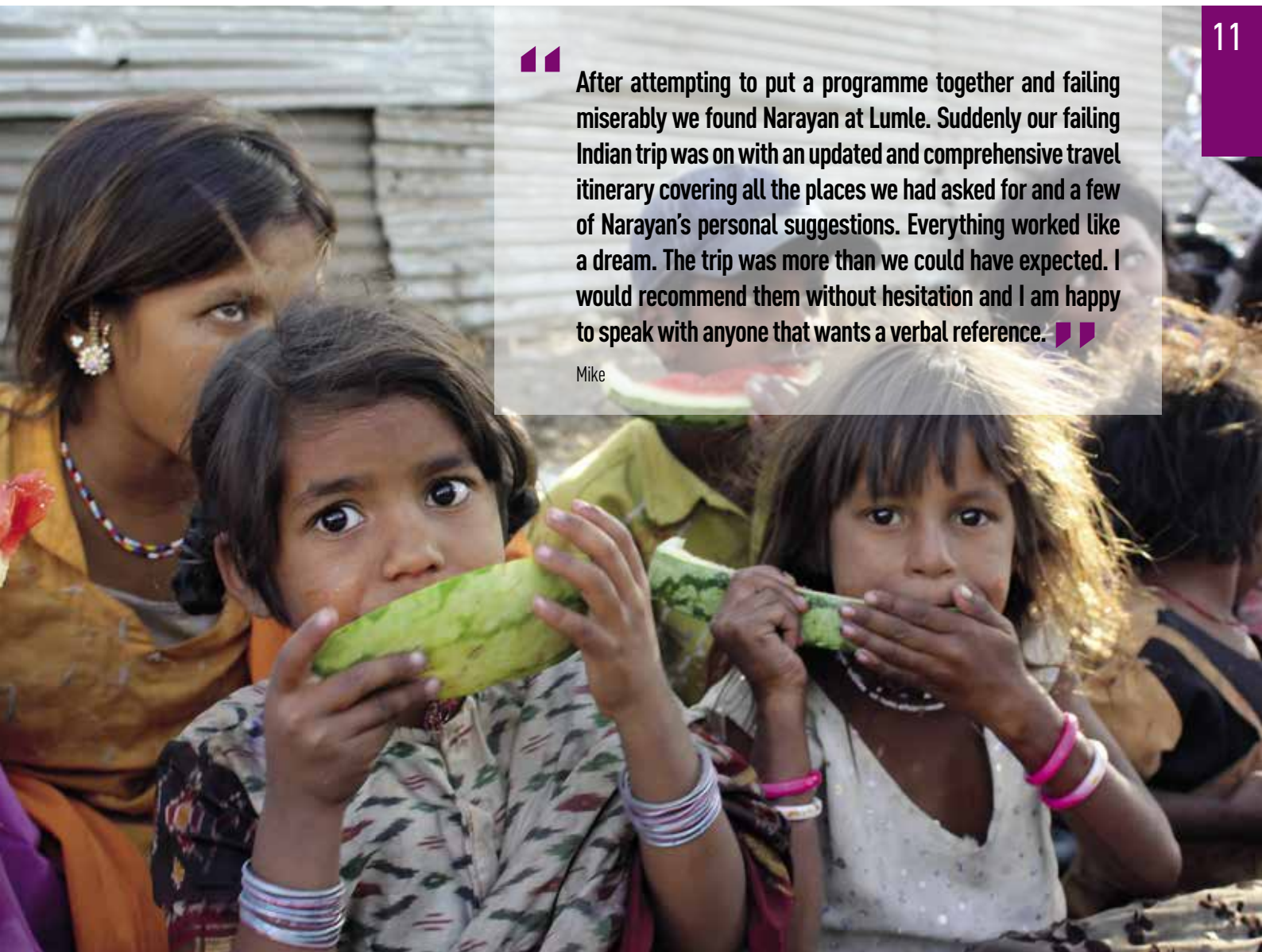
Agra

Gwalior

Described as the 'Pearl in the necklace of the castles' of India, it has played a great role in the history of India. Gwalior played an important part under the leadership of Rani Lakshmi Bai of Jhansi.

Khajuraho

Known for its elaborately sculpted temples depicting every aspect of Indian life ten centuries ago. Well preserved, the sculptures depict gods, goddesses, warriors, animals and amorous couples. It is also a host to the increasingly popular annual Khajuraho dance festival.

Varanasi

The eternal city, the most sacred pilgrim centre in India and a major tourist attraction. Varanasi is at its best at break of dawn and at dusk when chanting rings through the air and sacred lamps afloat light up the water. The city is well known for its silk and cotton handlooms.

Calcutta

This colonial capital of the British is in possession of the grand treasure of colonial heritage - visit the famous Victoria Palace, the main attraction of the city.

Orchha

Orchha lies on the Betwa River, 80 km from Tikamgarh and 15 km from Jhansi in Uttar Pradesh. Had the distinction of being the capital of one of the largest and most powerful kingdoms of Central India. It's one of the finest examples of Bundela architecture.

Darjeeling

Darjeeling can rightly be called as the éclat and splendour of nature. This hill town is perched at an altitude of 2134 meters directly opposite the ranges of Kanchenjunga the world's 3rd highest mountain.

The beautiful valley of Darjeeling is a popular hill station since the British regime and is encompassed by tea plantations on all sides. Laying in the eastern state of West Bengal the city offers the cool and chilly weather of Himalayas. The breath-taking sunrise and sunsets are memorable panorama at Darjeeling. It also offers a spectacular sight of the snow-capped mountains of the majestic Himalayas, the view of Kanchenjunga and Mount Everest are especially resplendent.

Sikkim

The petite and beautiful state of Sikkim located at the laps of Himalayas replete with nature, culture and adventure. Amritsar

The most holy city of Sikhs, Amritsar City derived its name from the water pool (Pool of Nectar), the 4th saintly teacher of the Sikh faith constructed that. The Sikhs holiest temple, the exquisite Golden Temple is also situated in the city of Amritsar decked with real gold leaf on its dome. The town is also known globally due to the occurrence of the historic Jallianwala Bagh massacre by the British General Dyer's.

Dharamsala

Dharamsala overlooks the plains and is surrounded by dense pine trees and Deodar forests. A nearby snowline with numerous streams and cool healthy atmosphere makes the surroundings very attractive. A busy bazaar town, Dharamsala has established itself as the travellers' base camp, who comes to explore the nearby mountains. Today, Dharamsala has become synonymous with the Tibetan government in exile and the home of Tibetan leader Dalai Lama.

Rishikesh

Rishikesh, a salubrious hill station of Uttarakhand, is located at the confluence of Ganga and Chandrabagha river. Surrounded by Shivalik ranges from three sides and positioned at the foothills of Garhwal Himalayas. Rishikesh is a famous Hindu pilgrimage destination.

Haridwar

Haridwar literally means 'Gates (dwar) of God (Hari)' is a pilgrimage destination of Hindus in Northern India. Haridwar is the place where the river Ganges descends to the plains. Before entering to Haridwar, river Ganges emerges from its final rapids past the Shivalik Hills. From time immemorial, Haridwar is considered as a major Shaktipeeth and believed to have sanctified by the Lord Brahma, Vishnu and Mahesh - the three most powerful Gods of Hindu mythologies.

Mumbai

The capital city of the state of Maharashtra is the commercial capital of the country. It is a constellation of seven islands, and is the busiest metropolis in India. It has an intriguing mixture of extremes-richness poverty, traditions and modernity urban and suburban. Mumbai is the home of prolific Indian Film Industry and generates most of its wealth from it.

Goa

A former Portuguese domain which retains much of its colonial flavour. The white churches and ruins, the Goan carnival, the laid back way of life, the white sandy palm fringed beaches everything lends a special touch of the exotic to this place.

Mahabalipuram

This 7th century city was the flourishing port and second capital of the Pallava Kings. The five rathas and the Shore temples are some of the most beautiful edifices to ancient architecture at Mahabalipuram.

Kanchipuram

The city of thousand temples. Considered the second holiest place in India. It is also renowned for its silk fabrics and sarees.

Pondicherry

Formerly a French colony, this union territory has the world famous Sri Aurobindo Ashram and contains the Matri Mandir, designed to be the spiritual centre of Auroville.

Kovalam

Situated approximately 13 kilometres south of Trivandrum, it is one of the best beaches in India. This peaceful health resort has a beauty of its own with small palm fringed bays separated by rocky headlands, pale sands, gentle surf and lush greenery.

Cochin

The 'Queen of the Arabian Sea' it has an ancient maritime history. Now the commercial capital of Kerala, the city is famous for its natural harbour.



Kumarakom

This tourist complex has unique house boats, trains, motor boats and water sport facilities. Here, visitors can hire house boats for cruises.

Chennai

If you want to know the real culture of South India then Chennai is the perfect gateway and the whole sole representation of south culture. Its time you include the name of Chennai in the list of your favourite destination, as it is one of the most cultured, modern and civilized metropolitan of India. It's a delight to watch the people of Chennai - women in dark silk sarees with a waste low hair tucked with jasmine flowers whereas their men folk usually in white wraparound with a white marks on their forehead.

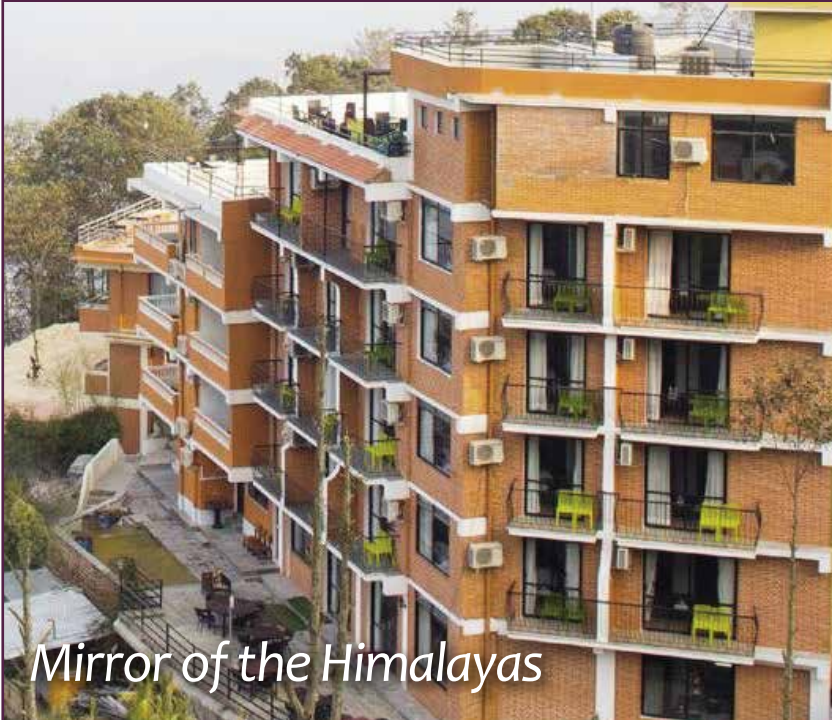

CULTURE EXPERIENCE

Nepal is a land that has a very glorious and ancient past that is visible in its architecture and the various monuments that it has. There are various other religious and cultural heritage sites that are present all over Nepal and these places are sure to take your breath away. If you are not really into trekking then a culture tour is sure to intrigue you.

Kathmandu

The Kathmandu valley has an exotic setting. It is surrounded by tier upon tier of green mountain walls above which towered mighty snow-capped peaks. It consists of the three main cities of great historic and cultural interest: Kathmandu, Lalitpur (Patan) and Bhaktapur (Bhadgaon). The Kathmandu valley covers an area of 218 square miles. It is situated at the height of 1,310 meters from the sea level.

Pashupatinath

One of the most sacred Hindu shrines in the world, Pashupatinath lies 05 kilometres east of the city centre at the edge of the holy Bagmati river. The richly-ornamented pagoda houses, the scared linga or phallic symbol of lord Shiva chronicles indicate the temples existence prior to 400 AD.

Kathmandu Durbar Square

So far as art and architecture are concerned, you need to look no further. This complex of places,

countryyards and temples built between the 12th and 18th century. The Durbar Square protected by UNESCO as the world heritage site in the social, religious and urban focal point of the city.

Bhaktapur

This is also the city of art and architecture. The 12th century palace of 55 windows, situated to the left as you enter through the city gate, inspires admiration. The entrance to the palace, the golden gate is a masterpiece in itself.

Boudhanath

It is also protected by UNESCO as an important world heritage site. It is the largest Buddhist Stupa in the world. It was built by Mandev in the 15th century AD.

Swyambhunath

It is situated in the west of Kathmandu city on the top of the hill. The huge Stupa is one of the holiest Buddhist sites in Nepal and is listed as a world heritage site.

Patan Durbar Square

It is protected by UNESCO as a world heritage site. The former Royal Palace complex is the centre of Patan's religious and social life. One remarkable monument here is the 17th century temple dedicated to the Hindu god Krishna, built entirely of stone.

Lumbini

Situated south west of Kathmandu, Lumbini is the birth place of Lord Buddha. It is, thus, the centre of Buddhist pilgrimage and Buddhist Philosophy. The old Ashoka Pillar, The Garden, The Maya Devi Temple, The Old Monastery are the places worth visiting in Lumbini. It has been registered as one of the worlds heritage site.

Bandipur

Bandipur is a picturesque town nestled in the Himalayan foothills of Nepal, a land as famous for its natural beauty as for the hospitality of its people. Bandipur lies midway between the capital Kathmandu and Pokhara, another popular tourist destination. Situated on a hilltop above the highway town of Dumre (7 km), Bandipur captivates visitors with its cultural appeal and pristine scenery. This Newar town has maintained its age-old flavour, and presents sightseers with a heady mix of history, architecture, incredible views, awesome caves and unspoiled landscapes.

Pokhara

It is one of the most beautiful places of the world which is a rare combination of the long arrays of snow clad peaks, crystal clear lakes, turbulent rivers with deep gorges and picturesque villages inhabited by simple and friendly ethnic people. Only a few places in the world might have such a splendid variety of natural beauty crammed into one small area like the valley of Pokhara. It is situated at the lap of panoramic Annapurna Himalayas.

Nagarkot

Nagarkot (altitude 2,175 metres) is by far the most popular. Located 30kms east of Kathmandu, Nagarkot has developed into a favourite weekend gateway among those seeking mountain views in comfort and quite. Jomsom

It is one of the most beautiful hill stations situated at the altitude of 8,800 ft., which is surrounded by the most beautiful mountains like Dhaulagiri, Nilgiri and Tukche peaks. The main important sightseeing sports around Jomsom are Marpha village containing an important Buddha monastery at its south end, Thini village containing naturally decorated beautiful lake known as Dhumpa Lake.

Muktinath

Situated at an altitude of 3745 meters above sea level, this is a small but one of the most scared Hindu Temples surrounded by the lofty Himalayas. The easiest access to Muktinath is to take a flight from Kathmandu or Pokhara to Jomsom and do a three day trek through Kagbeni. It can be reached by a 10 days trek from Pokhara. The trek is one of the most beautiful treks in Nepal passing through typical Nepali villages and viewing many mountains including Mt. Annapurna and Mt. Dhaulagiri.

Tansen Palpa

It is situated at an altitude of 1343 meters above sea level this is the most popular summer resort in "Western Part of Nepal". It has perhaps; Nepal's most far stretching views of the country's chief attraction, the Himalayas from Dhaulagiri in the west to the Gaurishankar in the north east. Seven hours of pleasant drive from Pokhara takes you to Tansen Palpa.

Muktinath Jomsom

Helambu

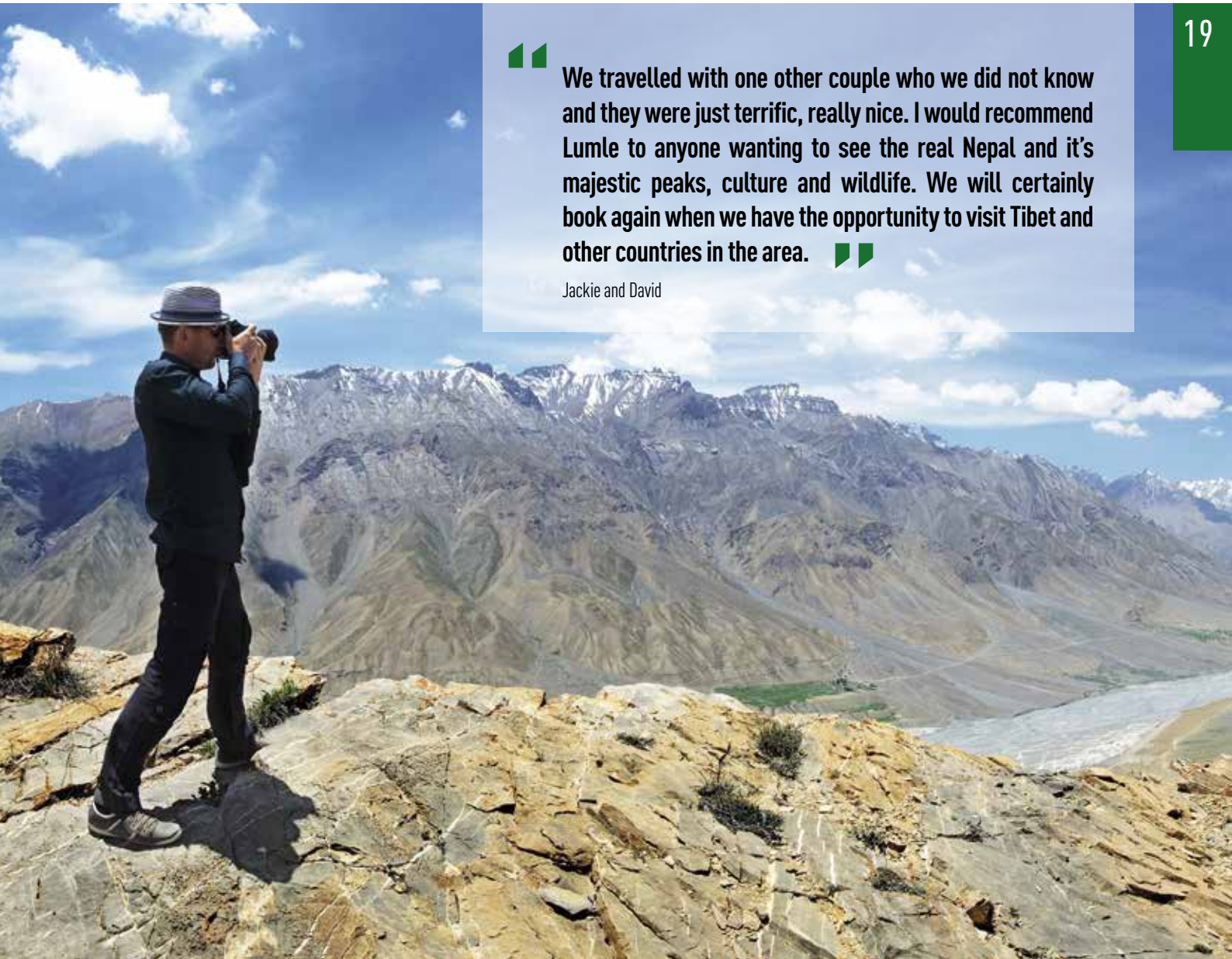

Everest

Trek follows a classic approach to Mt. Everest, the highest peak on earth. The Mount Everest or Solukhumbu region is primarily known for its mountains but also the Sherpa community who originated in Tibet and are now renowned climbers with many famous names amongst them. The route passes through the Sherpa villages and the alpine area. Once past Lukla, we climb to Namche, the main trading village of the Khumbu area, where time is spent acclimatizing before continuing on via Tengboche Monastery to Pheriche, Lobuche and the early morning ascent to Kala Pattar.

Makalu Base Camp

Trek takes deep into the eastern Himalayas, providing some of Nepal's most unseen and amazing sceneries. The Barun valley is part of a huge international protected area under an agreement between Nepal and China.

Manaslu

Manaslu is considered as one of the most challenging treks in Nepal. Manaslu Circuit will reward the adventurous with an unparalleled alpine experience. Opened in 1992, this area offers a combination of rich culture heritage, unsurpassed beauty, and biological diversity. The journey around these legendary mountains is among the most enjoyable.

Kanchenjunga

Kanchenjunga is one of the most remote and beautiful areas in Nepal, which is unused by foreign visitors, still lies shrouded in mystery. The features of the walk in are pleasant villages then in the high regions, glorious mountains and abundant wildlife. This includes musk deer, blue sheep and, for the believer, the Yeti. Magnificent views of Everest, Makalu and the Kanchanjunga massif will make the trip memorable.

Mustang

Mustang has a long and rich history shrouded in mystery going back to the 8th century. It is a very independent region drawing much of its history and culture from Tibet and still recognises itself as a Kingdom with their own King. The almost treeless landscape offers wonderful panoramic views of Nilgiri, Annapurna, and Dhaulagiri amongst many other soaring peaks.

Dolpo

Dolpa is a hidden valley created by a Buddhist deity for his worshippers. Today, it is celebrated as a sample of original Tibet. Blue sheep, Himalayan black bear and snow leopard are the most talked about fauna of this region.

PERFECT PEAKS

Peak climbing in Nepal's Himalayas is a dream for many climbers. With the world's highest mountains and more than 1300 snow-capped peaks, Nepal is justifiably the most popular destination for mountaineering expeditions.

Island Peak

Island Peak (6,189m/20,305ft) is one of the main climbing peaks of the Everest area. Island Peak has an impressive, highly glaciated West Face that rises from the Lhotse Glacier. This wonderful Island Peak trekking and climbing takes you into the heart of the Khumbu, Gokyo (4,750m/15,584ft) and Everest Base Camp (5,357m/17,575ft).

Cholatse Peak

Cholatse is a stunning peak with narrow snow and ice ridges and steep faces. It is on the ridge separating the Gokyo and Khumbu valleys, just north of Taboche and just south of a 5420 meter pass used by Sherpas and trekkers alike to go between the Gokyo and Khumbu valleys. Interestingly, there is a lake just below this pass to the east, and in Tibetan 'cho' is lake, 'la' is pass, and 'tse' is peak so Cholatse means literally "lake pass peak".

Mera Peak

Mera Peak (6,476m/21,247ft) is high enough to be seriously challenging but does not require serious mountaineering skills. This peak rises to the South of Everest and dominates the beautiful and remote valleys of Hinku and Hunku.

WILDLIFE EXPERIENCE

Surrounded by the greeneries and wilderness, Nepal has four major National Parks. Amongst them, Chitwan National Park and the Royal Bardia National Park. Jungle safaris are conducted on elephant rides, nature walk and bird watching, accompanied by a naturalist; on four wheel vehicles or by canoeing ride in the Rapti river at Chitwan or rafting in the Karnali river, Bardia. A visit to the nearby villages of the "Tharu" community is a highlight of the visit. Traditional Tharu stick dancing adds entertainment to the evening.

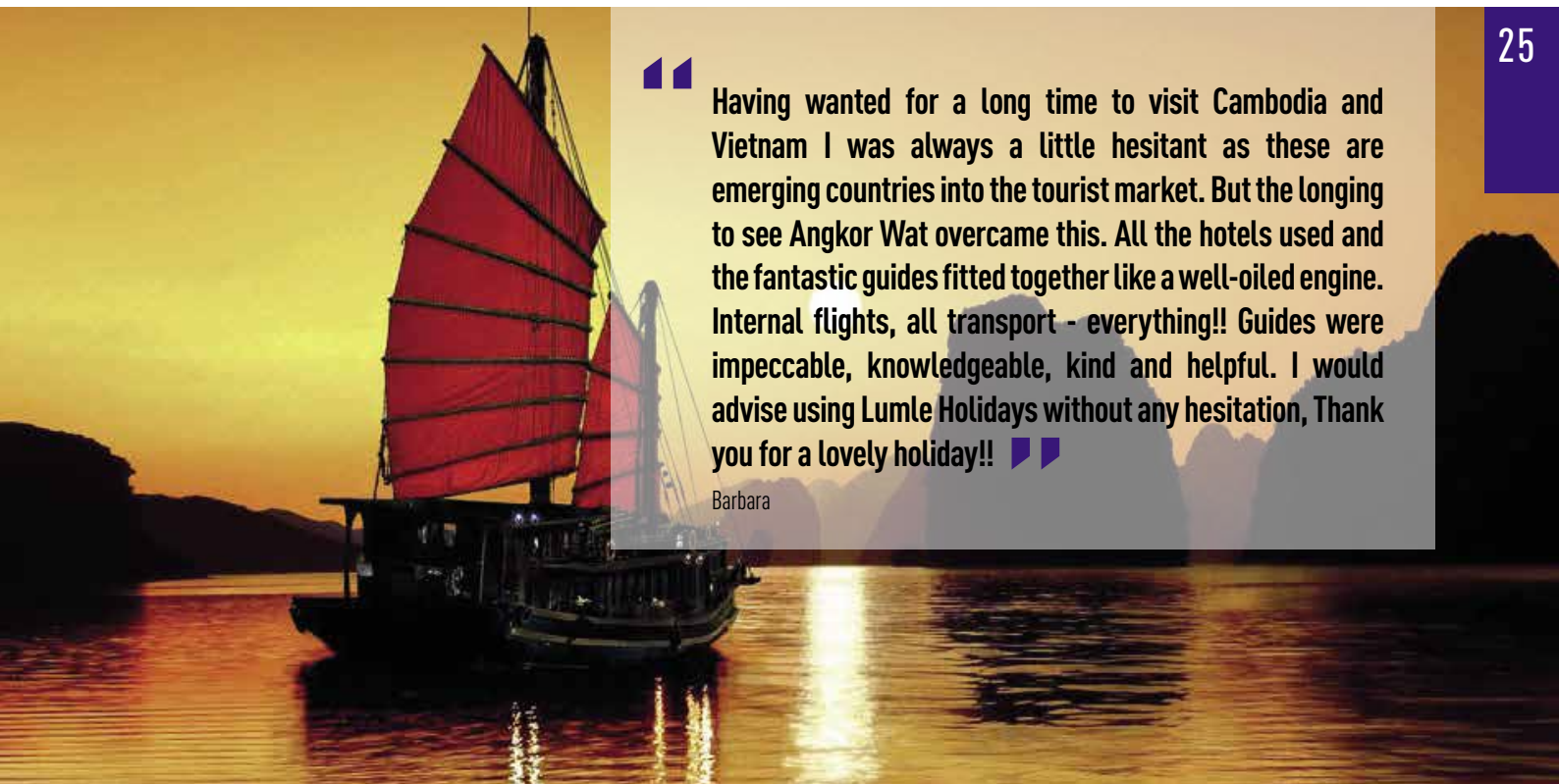

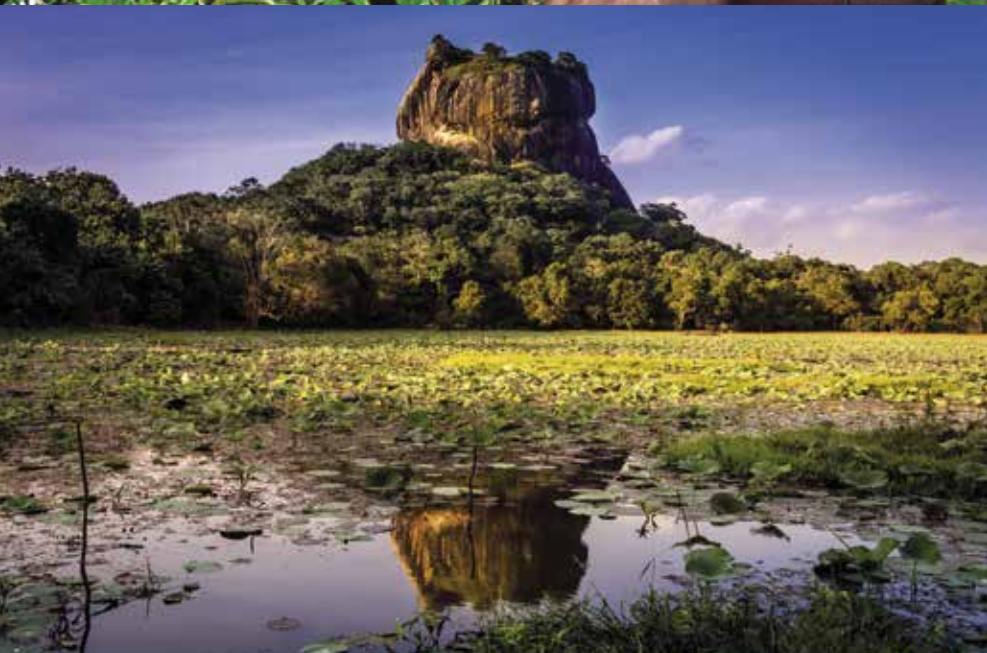

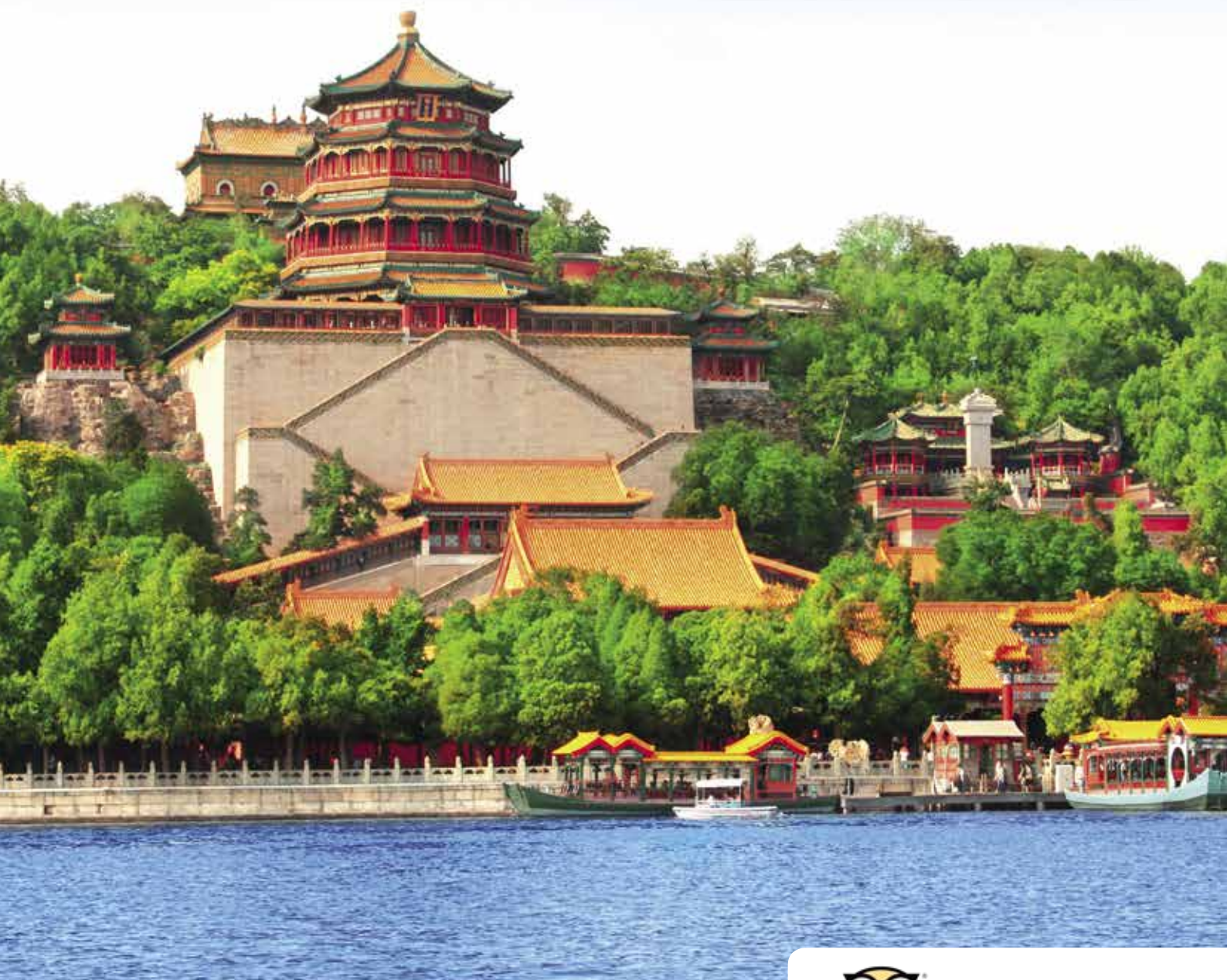

Great Wall Of China

Ancient Chinese Astronomers believed that the Purple Star (Polaris) was in the centre of heaven and the Heavenly Emperor lived in the Purple Palace. The Palace for the emperor on earth was so called the Purple City. It was forbidden to enter without special permission of the emperor. Thus, its name 'The Purple Forbidden City', usually 'The Forbidden City'.

The Summer Palace

Located in the Haidian District northwest of Beijing, Summer Palace is around 9 miles (15 kilometers) from central Beijing. Being the largest and most well-preserved royal park in China, it significantly influences Chinese horticulture and landscape with its famous natural views and cultural interests, which also has long been recognized as 'The Museum of Royal Gardens'.

Where the damages relate to the provision of transport by air, sea or rail, or hotel accommodation, any compensation payable will be further limited by the EU Charter of Passengers Rights for air travel, the Warsaw Convention as amended, by the Athens Convention 1974 (sea), the Berne Convention 1961 (rail), and the Paris Convention 1962 (hotel accommodation), or any such statute or regulation as may from time to time amend or supersede any of the above. Copies of the conditions of carriage and any conventions that may apply are available on request.

Any independent arrangements that you make that are not part of the holiday are entirely at your own risk. Should you or any member of your party by misadventure suffer illness, injury or death during the period of your holiday from an activity which does not form part of the arrangements made by us nor an excursion purchased through us, you are responsible to cover the costs. We strongly recommend you have valid comprehensive travel insurance to cover any events whilst you are on your holiday.

Under EU Law (Regulation 261/2004) you have rights in some circumstances to refunds and/or compensation from your airline in cases of denied boarding, cancellation or delay to flights. Full details of these rights will be publicised at EU airports and will also be available from airlines. However, reimbursement in such cases will not automatically entitle you to a refund of your holiday cost from us

6. FORCE MAJEURE

'Force Majeure' means (without restriction) any event which Lumle Holidays Ltd. could not, even with all due care, foresee or avoid. Compensation in the case of death or injury: There are no financial limits to the liability for passenger injury or death. For damages up to 113,100 Special Drawing Rights ("SDRs") the air carrier cannot contest claims for compensation. Above that amount, the air carrier can defend itself against a claim by proving that it was not negligent or otherwise at fault.

13. KAILASH PILGRIMAGE & TIBET HOLIDAYS RISK & LIABILITY

Health: This is one of the toughest high-altitude road journeys on earth. You must be physically fit – no two ways about that. Generally patients with asthma & heart problems have a problem acclimatising to high altitudes. In your interests it is essential you should be examined by your doctor to know about your health condition and your ability to cope up with the rigors of high altitude travel for days in 'no road' conditions, extreme cold, dust, trekking to an altitude of 22028ft (6714m) during the Parikrama, etc.

Altitude Sickness: As you are traveling over high terrain, you are likely to experience symptoms and discomfort of altitude sickness (headache, loss of appetite, nausea, exhaustion, sleeplessness, breathlessness etc.) until your body adjusts to the elevation. This can take a couple of days or more depending on an individual. For this reason alone, we have made it mandatory to stay 2 nights at Nyalam (12000ft) and a night in Simkot those who take journey of Helicopter before moving on to the higher altitudes. Drink plenty of water, be calm, and do not exercise. Do not drink alcohol or smoke prior to and during the tour. We also recommend you carry a strip of diamox tablets. Do consult your physician on the dosage. We provide Gamow bag (special equipment to prevent sickness from high altitude) on this tour.

Risk: Trip to Mt. Kailash/ Mansarover is the cause of Pilgrimage. This is an adventure travel into a remote Himalayan Destination with alien weather & geographical conditions; unpredictable weather in Himalayas sometimes requires change in the tour program/tour routing. Tourism infrastructure in Tibet area is under developed, road condition lodges etc. during journey are very basic, so kindly be prepared for a rough tough time for the Journey of a Life time to Holy Kailash/ Mansarover for spiritual enlightenment.

Liability: Every care would be taken to extend the best possible services to make the pilgrim's stay & travel as comfortable as possible but considering the nature of Yatra/Trip it is requested not to expect the impeccable services as some unforeseen & uncontrollable factors like Political, Natural & Medical etc. can change the course of Yatra/Trip. All the tours in Tibet are conducted strictly under the rules & regulation of Tibet Tourism Bureau (TTB). Therefore, Lumle Holidays Ltd. and its counterpart shall not be responsible for any change and alteration in the program due to unavoidable circumstances such as landslide, road blockage, flood, snow, political unrest, and cancellation of flight, delay arrival, sickness or accidents. Any extra cost incurred thereof shall be borne by the clients on the spot. No claim would be entertained for any unutilized services due to any unforeseen circumstances, so Lumle Holidays Ltd. and its principal supplier or subagent would not be responsible for any Liability.
